

## ADVANCED THERAPY PRACTICUM SITE

**POSITION:**                **Advanced Practicum Student (2 positions)**

**POSITION SUMMARY:** The practicum counselor will provide part-time (16-20 hours per week) direct services to students and consultation to the campus community during the 2009-10 academic year (late August through mid-May).

**QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Enrollment in a doctoral program in Counseling or Clinical Psychology.
- Ability to work independently.
- Comfort working with a broad range of presenting issues, and with diverse cultural and ethnic groups, within a Christian institution.
- Ability to relate effectively to college students, as well as college professionals, including campus ministry staff, Student Affairs staff, and faculty.
- Ability to work effectively as part of a team, and comfortable with the dynamics of a small institution.
- Some previous experience providing counseling is required.
- Preference given to those currently holding masters degree in counseling-related field

**LEARNING EXPERIENCES:**

- Provide psychological counseling services to students experiencing emotional distress, developmental difficulties, behavioral issues, or other mental health-related problems.
- Provide crisis intervention.
- Develop and deliver educational programming to address the developmental and mental health needs of students.
- Provide consultation to faculty, staff, and students on mental health and developmental issues.
- Assist in providing mental health-related training for various campus groups (e.g., residence hall staff, security staff, etc., as needed)
- Make appropriate referrals to community resources, as needed.

**SUPERVISION:** Practicum students will receive one to two hours of supervision per week, depending on graduate program requirements and practicum students' training needs.

Applications accepted in early 2009. Interviews will take place as applications come in and until positions are filled. A completed application includes a letter of interest, resume or curriculum vitae, a transcript of all graduate work, and list of three references who can be contacted regarding the applicant's clinical skills.
