## 1. Research Process

**Research is a process;** it involves browsing resources for a topic, narrowing a focus, & developing a primary research a question; generating a search strategy, finding & evaluating materials; taking notes, citing sources correctly, using information legally & ethically, & finally producing a paper/project.

## 3. Databases - Use these to search for articles on a particular topic. Use the advanced search features to combine keywords using “and” or “or” to limit or expand hits, limit dates, material type and other features.

### a. Searching Tips

- i. Ex. Cat and dog (everything that has both cat & dog) cat or dog (everything that has either cat or dog)
- ii. Use truncation and phrase searching for better results, Ex. “Fighting like cats and dogs” (will look for those words exactly as in “”) or Fight\* (will find fight, fights, fighting, etc.)

### b. Find the databases listed under **Databases: A to Z, by subject** link

- i. **Academic Search Premier** –Search for journal articles covering a variety of topics.
  - ii. **ProQuest** – Search several databases including two education ones for scholarly journals and newspapers covering a variety of topics.
  - iii. **ERIC** – Search this database for literature about education and psychology.
  - iv. **Sage Online** – Full text scholarly journal articles, including education and psychology journals.
  - v. **PsychARTICLES** – Search a psychology database of full text and article citations.
  - vi. **Education Databases** – See education databases page for a complete list of databases for the education discipline.
  - vii. **Psychology Databases** – See psychology databases page for a complete list of databases for the psychology discipline.
- c. Use your network username (generally last name and first initial) and your password (L# unless you have it reset by the Help Desk).

## 4. Finding Full Text Articles From Citations & ILL

- a. Check to see if journal title and appropriate volume are available through CLICnet or Journal Finder/Article Linker
- b. For articles not available through print or Journal Finder, fill out ILL form found under Help, Forms and Requests

- c. Use Article Linker to populate ILL form (available in ProQuest and EBSCO databases)
  - d. If journal volume is available through CLICnet (1-3 days), if not then it could take up to 3 weeks to fill request
- 5. Net Library** – This is a collection of online books. They cover high interest and current topics. You will need to create a username & password for this database while logged on as a Concordia student in order to create a list of favorites, etc. Access through databases page rather than CLICnet to avoid login issues.
- 6. CLICnet** – This is the online catalog for Concordia and the Consortium. Use this to find books, journal titles, and the other materials present in the library.
- a. Advanced Search – Use this to combine keywords to find materials on the subject you are studying. You can also place other limits to your search.
  - b. Use keywords (natural language) or subject headings (official Library of Congress categories) to search
  - c. Use the red request button to request items from other CLIC schools
  - d. My Account – Use this to check the due-dates of books, renew books, and status of holds
  - e. Students outside the 7 county metro areas can have books mailed to them. Request all CLICnet books using the red request button; notify the library ([reference@csp.edu](mailto:reference@csp.edu)) that you have made a request so that a message can be put in your library record to mail books to your home address.

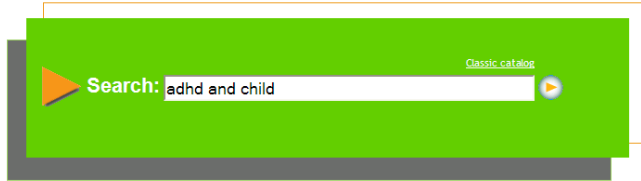


NetLibrary is a database containing eBooks. Find this database in the Articles (Databases A to Z, by Subject) section. Create a free account if you want to save a list of items.



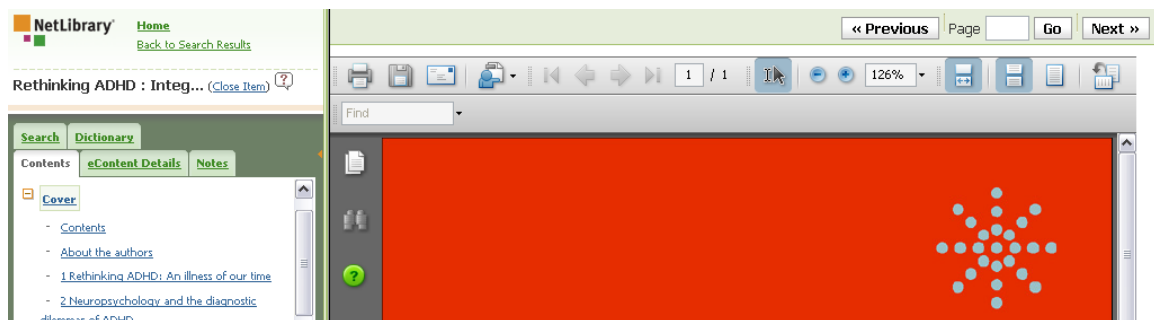

## Finding Information on the Web

There is a lot of information available on the Internet. Use the criteria below when looking at online information to help you determine if you have a reputable website to use.

### Evaluation Criteria

- **Accuracy.** If your page lists the author and institution that published the page and provides a way of contacting him/her and...
- **Authority.** If your page lists the author credentials and its domain is preferred (.edu, .gov, .org, or .net), and...
- **Objectivity.** If your page provides accurate information with limited advertising and it is objective in presenting the information, and ...
- **Currency.** If your page is current and updated regularly (as stated on the page) and the links (if any) are also up-to-date, and...
- **Coverage.** If you can view the information properly—not limited to fees, browser technology, or software requirement, then...

**You may have a higher quality Web page that could be of value to your research!**

### Google Scholar

Google Scholar (<http://scholar.google.com>) makes it possible to search for scholarly literature on the web. Using this tool, one can find peer-reviewed papers, theses, books, preprints, abstracts and technical reports in many disciplines.

### Customizing Google Scholar for Your Library

Setting Google Scholar to link to Concordia University Library's holdings

- Go to Google Scholar. You can do this in a couple of ways. One option is to choose "more" from the Google homepage, [www.google.com](http://www.google.com).
- Then choose "Scholar" from the list.
- You can also go directly to <http://scholar.google.com>.
- Select "Scholar Preferences," found next to the search box.
- Type "Concordia University" in the "Library Links" search box. Click on "Find Library."
- Place a check in the "Concordia University, St. Paul" box, and click on "Save Preferences."
- Perform a search and any items with online holdings at Concordia will have a link to those items.
